Cost to Participate:	\$20 per Doe (Includes Pen Rental Fee*)
Check-In:	May 31, 2025 4:00 pm - 6:30 pm EST ADGA Registration Papers Must be Present Date of Freshening will be Recorded Milk Test Paperwork Will be Completed
First Milk Out/Udder Checks:	May 31, 2025 7:00 pm EST SHARP Check Tattoos Height @ Withers Measured & Recorded (Nigis Only) Udder Check by Superintendent - Must be EMPTY
Second Milk Out:	June 1, 2025 7:00am EST SHARP Milk Out Doe Milk Weighed & Sampled by Tester
Third Milk Out:	June 1, 2025 7:00pm EST SHARP Milk Out Doe Milk Weighed & Sampled by Tester
Dismissal:	After final test is complete and paperwork is checked, doe is dismissed. *Participants must clean out the pens they have used before leaving, or pay a Buy Out Fee of \$5 per pen to the club.
Most Milk Award:	The doe with the most milk produced on test day will receive an award from the COANDGC. Should Standard does enter the competition, there will be two awards given, one for each division.
Notification of Results:	Results and points awarded will be emailed to doe's owner upon receipt.

FAQs

Q. How does a doe earn a *M on a One Day Milk Test?

Based upon the return of the milk components testing from the lab, the Standard doe must earn 18 or more points, and the Nigerian must earn 7 or more points for automatic *M designation without application or fee.

Q. How are points awarded?

1. For each pound of milk, one point figured to one decimal place.
2. For each complete ten days the goat has been in milk since last kidding, 0.1 of a point, with a maximum of 3.6 points for standard breeds and .04 of a point with a maximum of 1.44 points for the Nigerian.
3. For each .05 pounds of butterfat yielded in the milkings, one point.

Q. How does ADGA award the star?

The results of the milk test are automatically forwarded to ADGA from the testing lab, DHI Cooperative, Inc. ADGA will notify you if your doe has earned a *M after they have processed the awards.

Q. Can I enter a Standard doe in the competition even if the show is for Nigerians only?

YES

Q. Do I have to sign up for DHI with ADGA to participate?

No! COANDGC is taking care of the ADGA licensing fees for us to hold this One Day Milking Competition.

Q. How do I sign up my does to participate in this competition?

Sign ups will begin when show entries open on May 5, 2025. Entries close on May 28, 2025 at 11:59 PM

Q. Can I still show my Milk Test doe in the Nigerian ADGA/AGS shows on Sunday?

YES! We have hired three VERY competent and successful judges who understand that several does may be on test that day and will not be full in the ring. You may notify the judge that the doe is on test when he/she comes around to ask about her. On a personal note, I (Erica) have witnessed an empty Nigerian doe win GCH at a very competitive show before.
